WHO WE ARE AND HOW WE APPROACH DATA PRIVACY

We are The British Inspiration Trust, Charity Number: 1137795. registered Office c/o /o University of The Chichester, Bognor Regis Campus, Upper Bognor Road, West Sussex, PO21 1HR.

Our use of your personal information is regulated under the General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/679)) for as long as the United Kingdom is a member of the European Union or is subject to any transition arrangements after leaving the European Union, the Data Protection Act 2018 and any other privacy related laws or regulations the UK may implement as a result of it leaving the European Union. We are responsible as "Controller" for the purposes of those laws

We are committed to protecting and respecting the privacy of your personal information. We want you to be confident that your information will be properly protected whilst in our possession. If you have any questions about our use of your personal information, or you wish to exercise one of your rights under data protection legislation, please contact us. Twitter

We may use the Twitter “Follow Button” plugin to help us raise awareness of **The British Inspiration Trust (BRIT)** and our **annual BRIT Challenges** using Twitter and Hashtags **#BRIT** or **#RowBritannia** (our 2019/20 Challenge) or **#TheBRITChallenge** (our annual challenge) and, for example, **#BRIT2021Challenge** (our 2021 Challenge) - The plugin detects whether you are logged in to Twitter when you visit our website and uses this information to present either a “Follow” or “You Follow” message with various other details from Twitter. Most of our cookies expire within 30 days, although our analytics cookies may persist for 2 years.

Do I have to provide this information?

In most cases the personal information you provide to us in the table above is entirely voluntary. You are not under a statutory or contractual obligation to provide it to us.

However, where we need to collect personal data under the terms of a **contract** we have with you and you fail to provide that data when requested, we may not be able to perform our **contract** with you.

PROVIDING US WITH PERSONAL INFORMATION OF ANOTHER PERSON

If you need to provide us with personal information about another person you must obtain that individual's **express consent** to pass us their information. You should share this notice with those individuals as it may also apply to them.

AUTOMATED DECISION-MAKING

We do not envisage that any decisions will be taken about you using automated means, however we will notify you in writing if this position changes.

DATA SHARING

Why might you share my personal information with carefully selected parties?

We may have to share your personal data with the carefully selected parties set out below for the purposes set out in the table above:

- Carefully selected parties who provide a service to us to support our core operations, such as: processing our mail, communicating with supporters/participants and prospective supporters/participants on our behalf (including via social media), running promotions, providing Fundraising Pages, providing IT systems and administrative services and the development and improvement of internal systems and processes. This includes
 - a. Quirkie
 - b. Virgin Money Giving (VMG)
- Competent authorities (statutory bodies, regulatory authorities, authorised bodies who have a role laid out by law);
- Other organisations where we are legally obligated to disclose your personal information (such as requests made in the prevention and detection of crime) or where disclosure is necessary to protect the property, rights and safety of us and our staff;
- Other companies where we are trialling products and services which we consider may improve our offering to customers and/or our business processes; and
- Other third parties where you have given your express **consent** or where we reasonably believe a third party is acting on your behalf.

We require all third parties to respect the security of your personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We do not allow our third-party service providers to use your personal data for their own purposes and only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

International Transfers

We do not transfer your personal data outside the United Kingdom and the European Economic Area (EEA).

DATA SECURITY

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal information to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need-to-know. They will only process your personal information on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected data security breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected breach where we are legally required to do so.

RIGHTS OF ACCESS, CORRECTION, ERASURE, AND RESTRICTION

Your rights in connection with personal information

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- **Request access** to your personal information (commonly known as a “data subject access request”). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- **Request correction** of the personal information that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- **Request erasure** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes.
- **Request the restriction of processing** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- **Request the transfer** of your personal information to another party.

If you want to review, verify, correct or request erasure of your personal information, object to the processing of your personal data, or request that we transfer a copy of your personal information to another party, please contact Data Officer in writing.

No fee usually required

You will not have to pay a fee to access your personal information (or to exercise any of the other rights). However, we may charge a reasonable fee if your request for access is clearly unfounded or excessive. Alternatively, we may refuse to comply with the request in such circumstances.

What we may need from you

We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access the information (or to exercise any of your other rights). This is another appropriate security measure to ensure that personal information is not disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it.

Time limit to respond

We try to respond to all legitimate requests within one month. Occasionally it may take us longer than a month if your request is particularly complex or you have made a number of requests. In this case, we will notify you and keep you updated.

DATA PROTECTION OFFICER

We have appointed a data representative to oversee compliance with this Privacy Notice.
